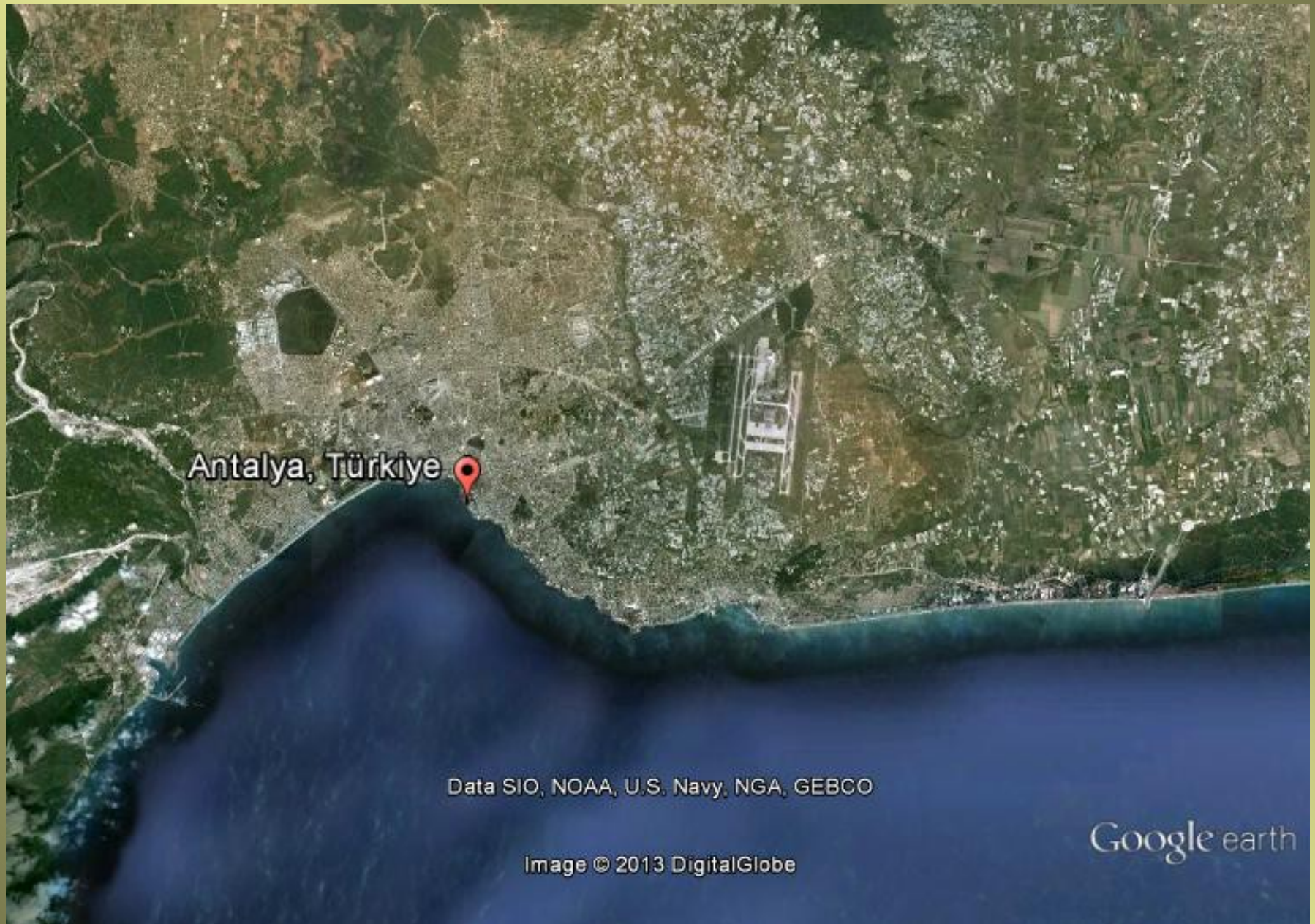

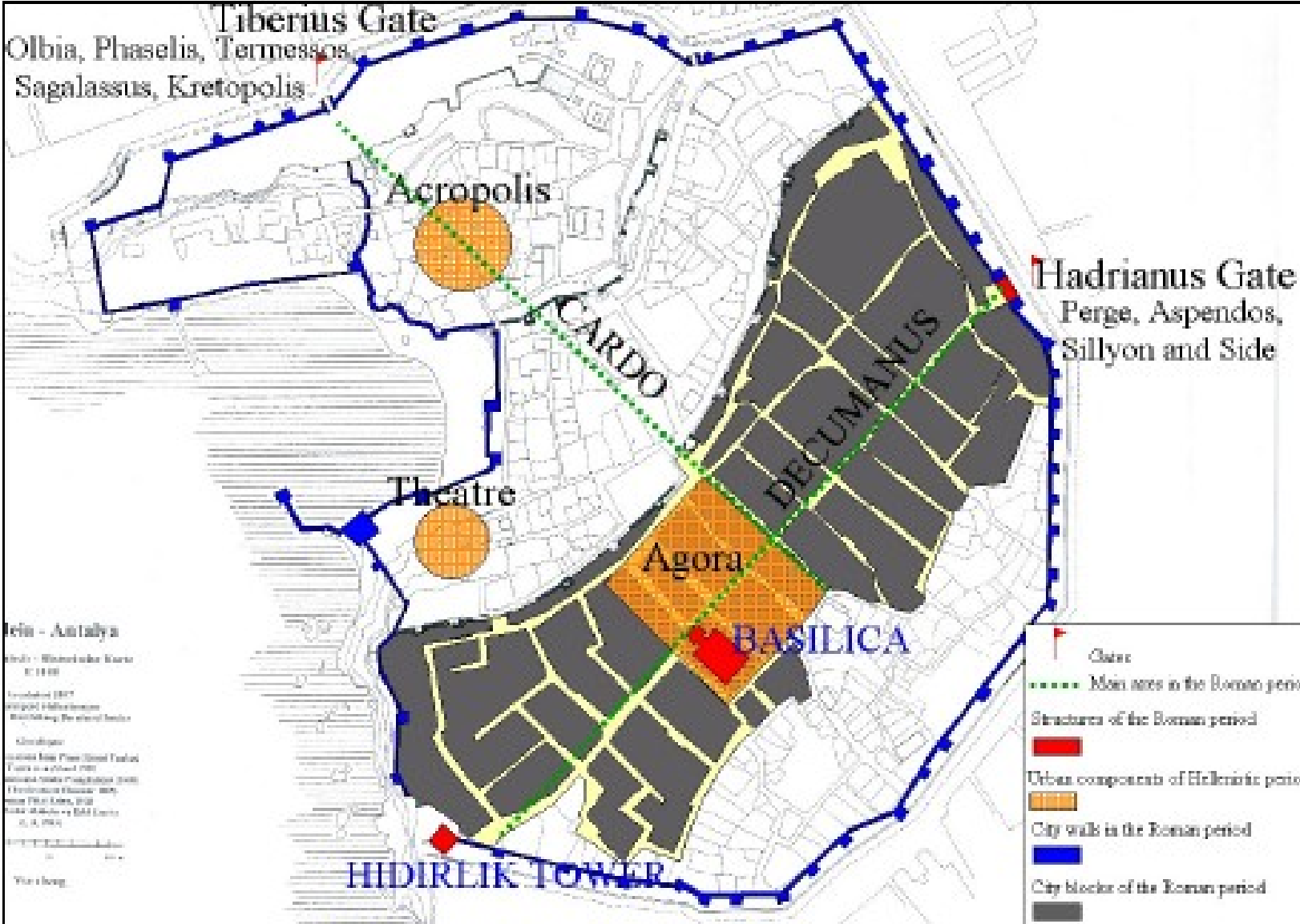

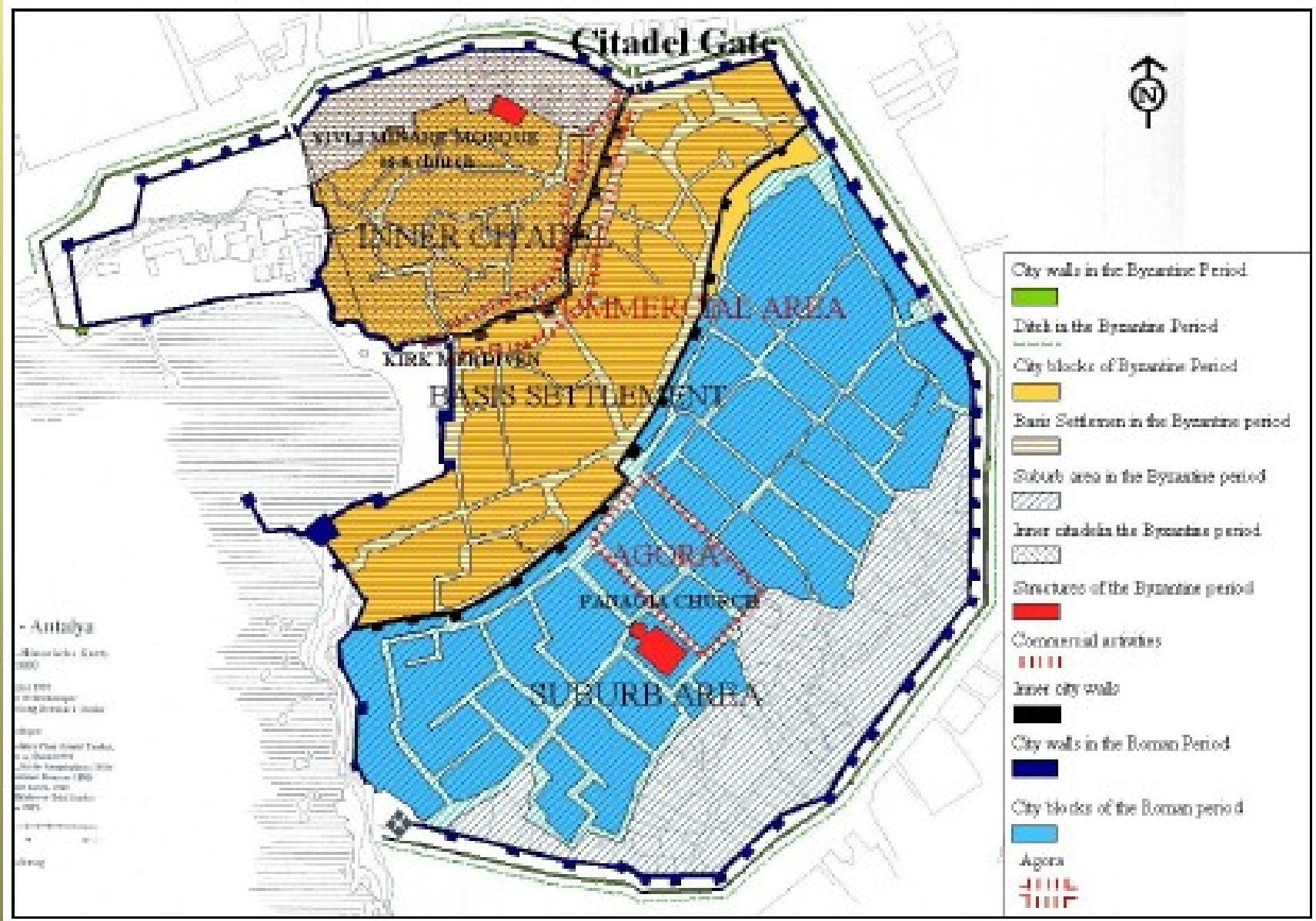
Possible Urban structure of the Walled Town in the Roman Period

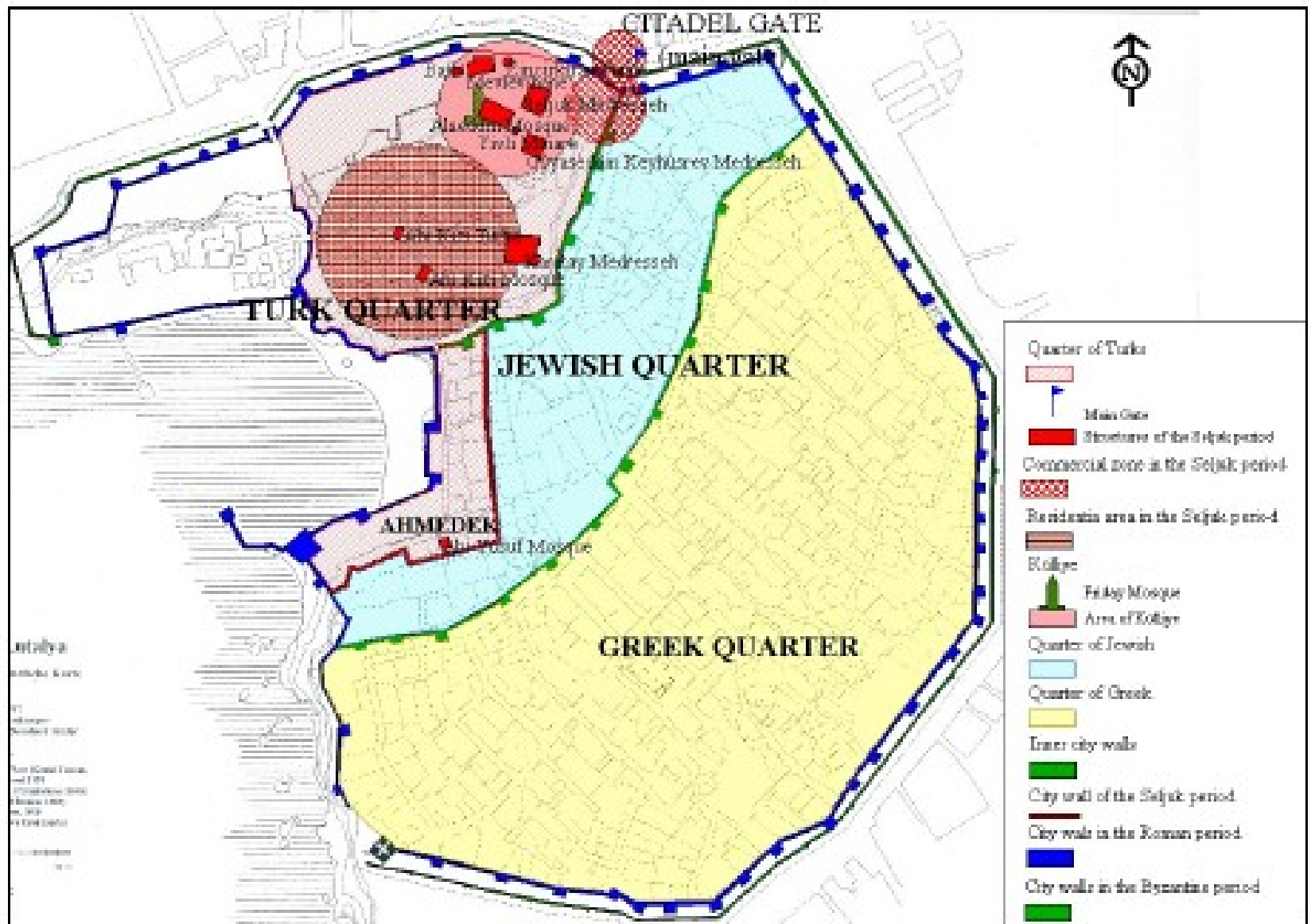

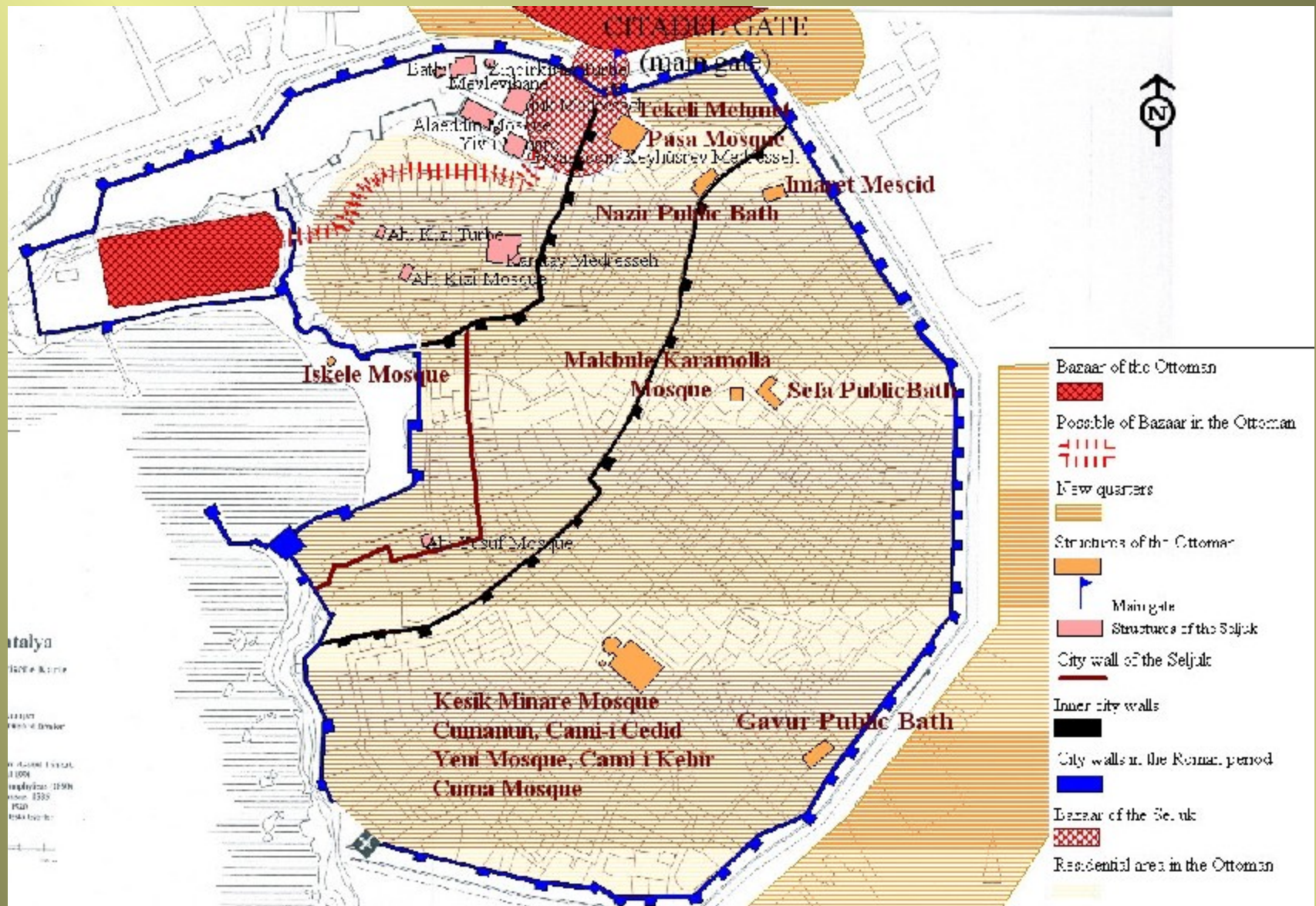


Possible Urban structure of the Walled Town in the Byzantine Period

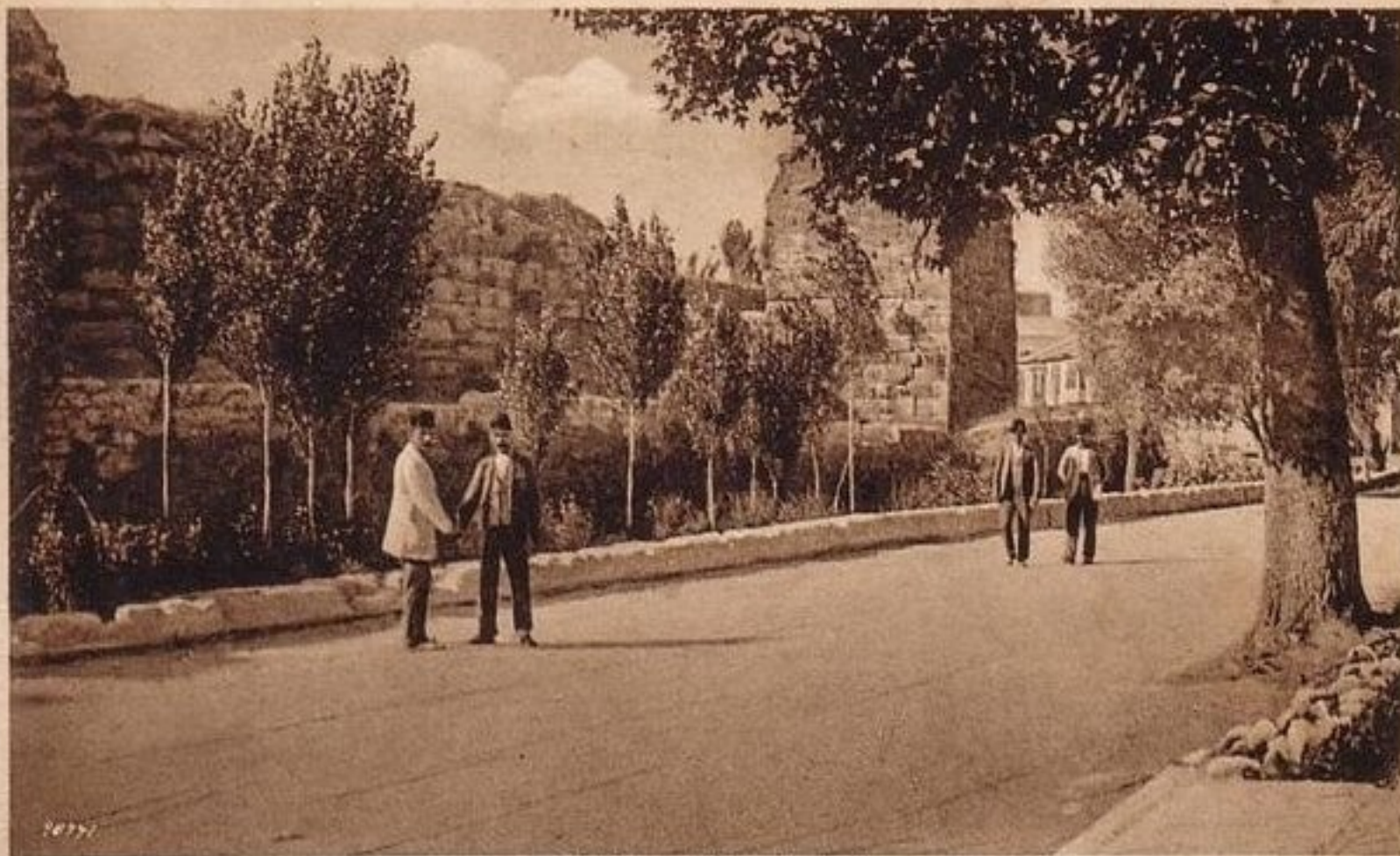

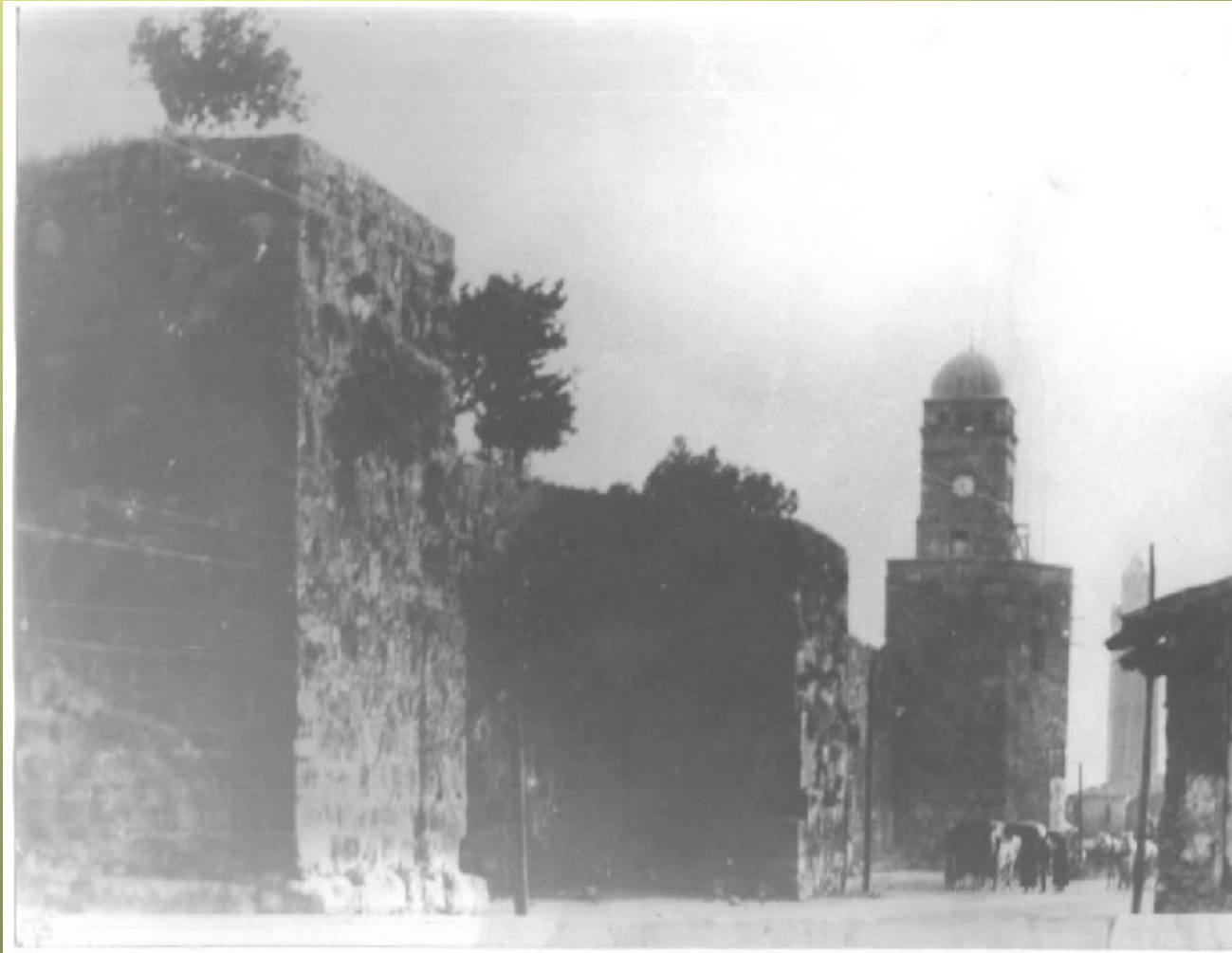

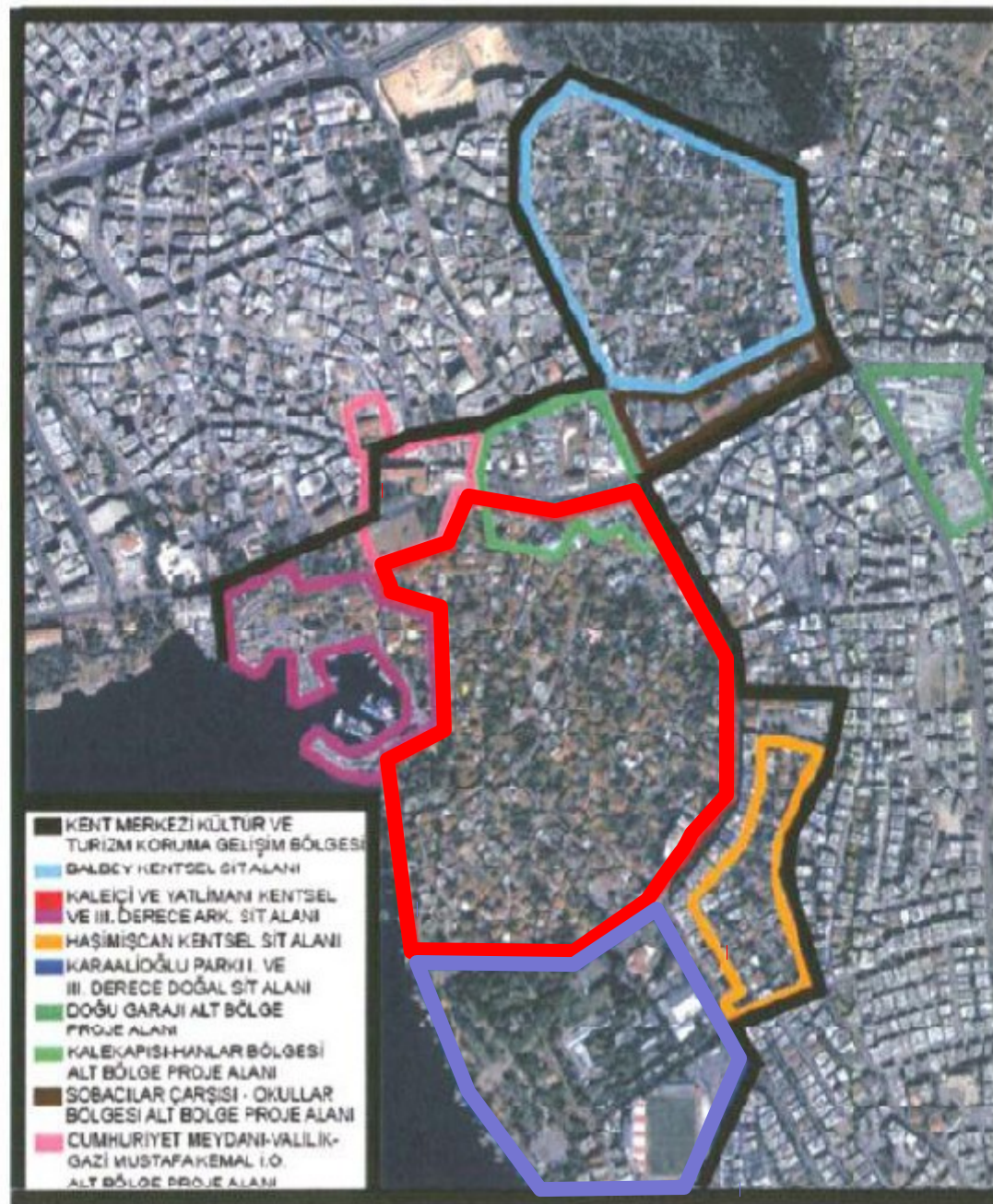




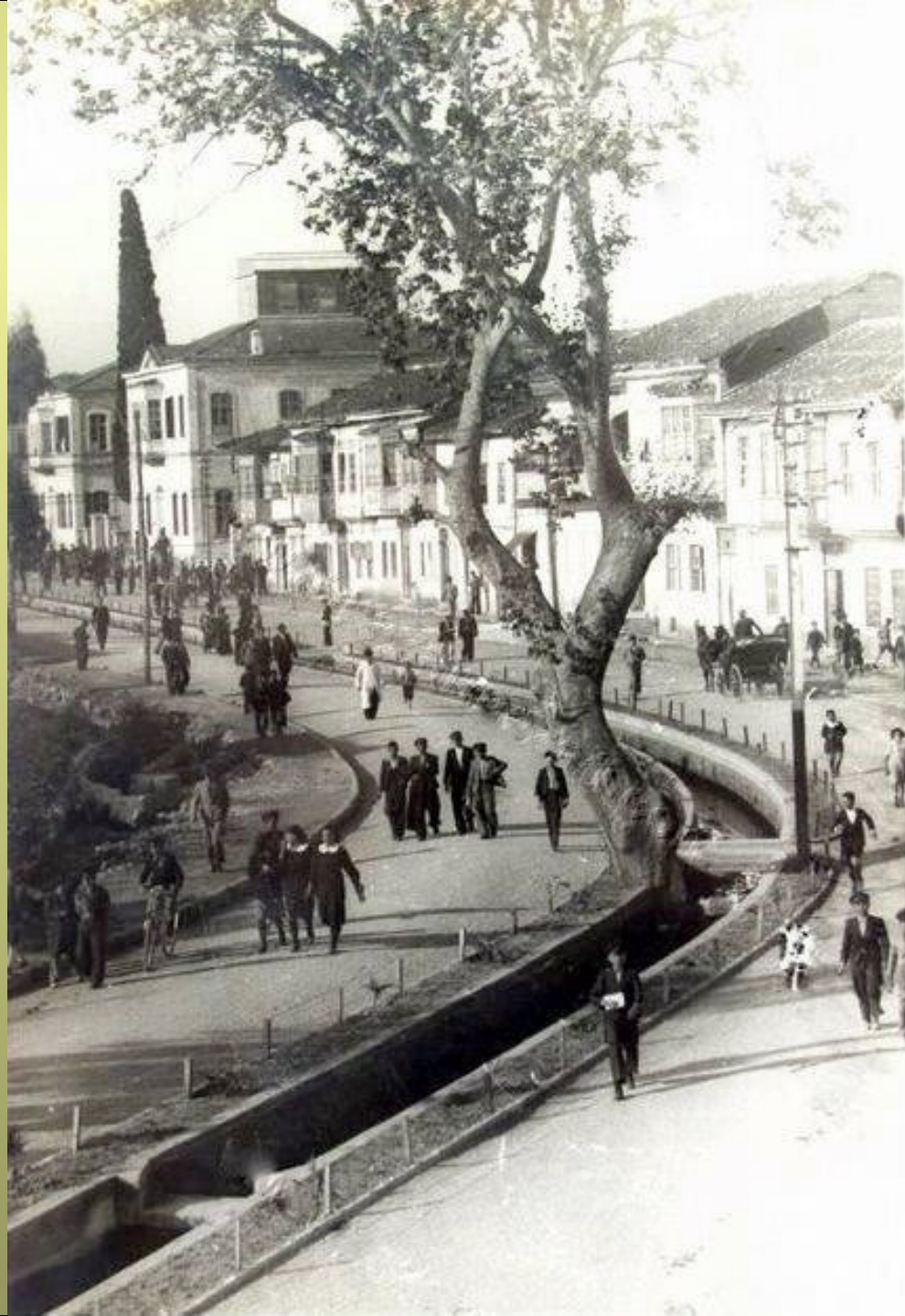
Town walls at the Main Gate in 1915, before the demolition

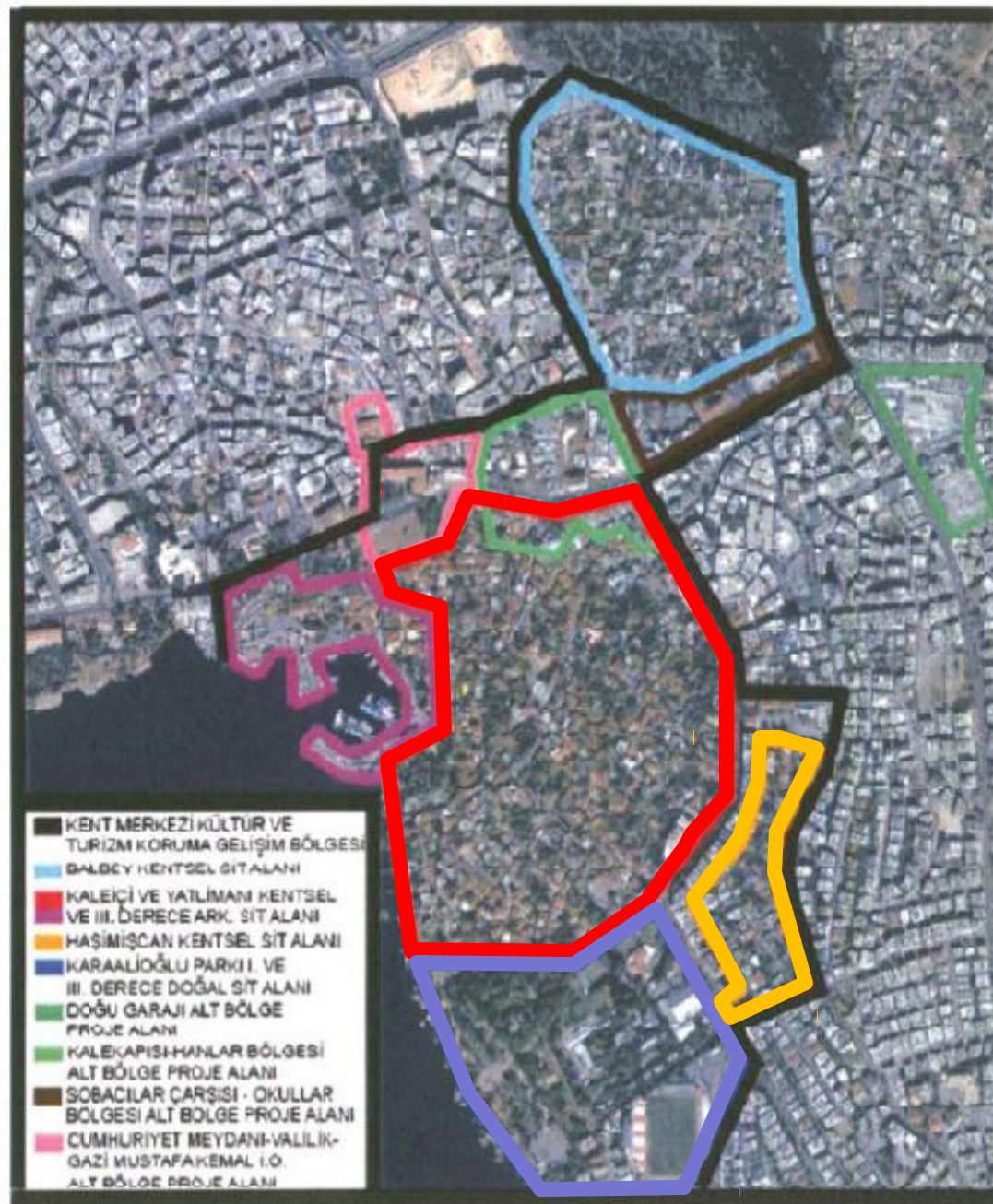

The perimeter length of the walls is approximately 2000 meters. The structural characteristics of the walls are:

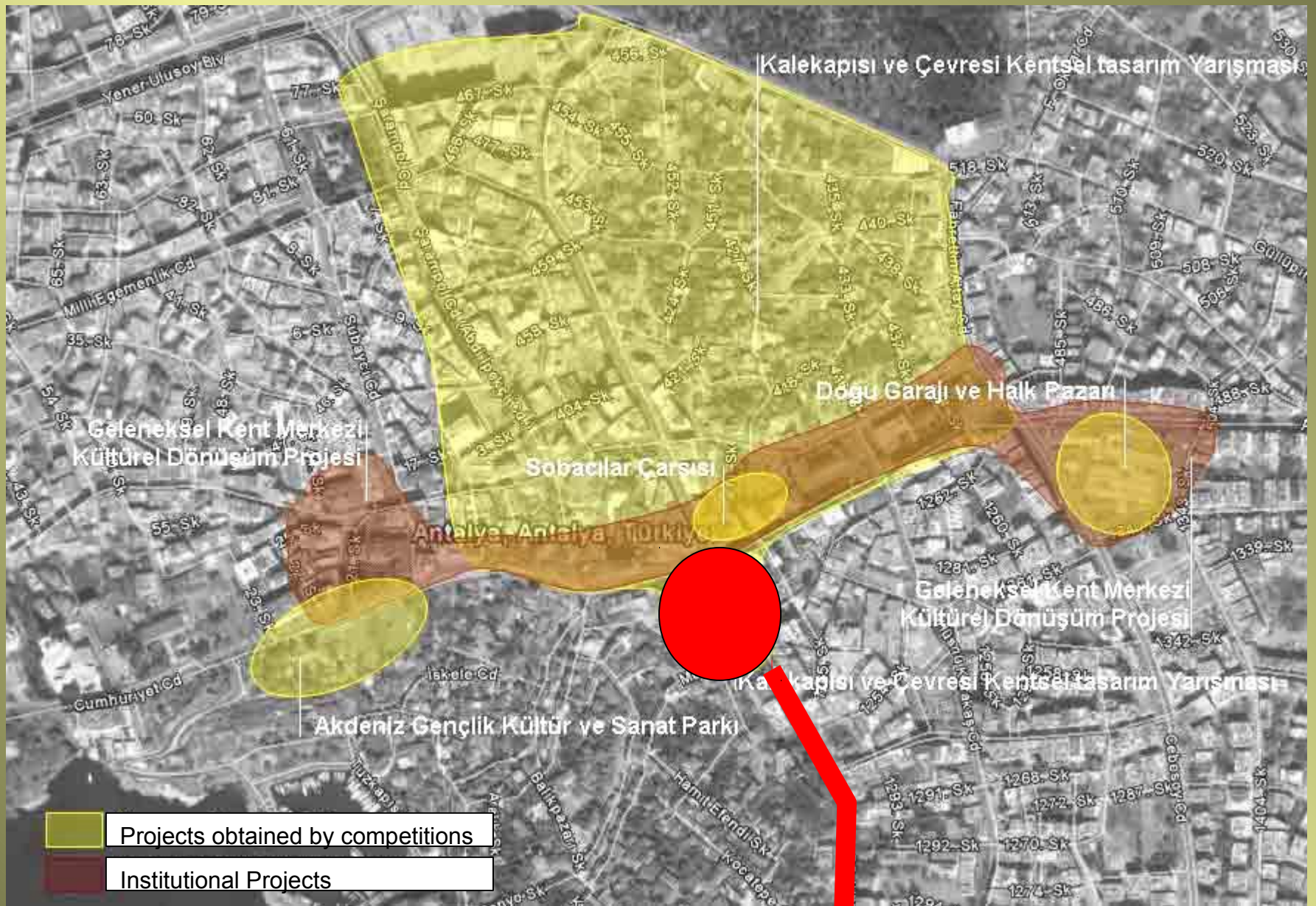
- they are straight type
