






Possible Urban structure of the Walled Town in the Roman Period Source: Süer 2006




Hadrian Gate in 1882 and 2012



Possible Urban structure of the Walled Town in the Byzantian Period Source: Süer 2006




Possible Urban structure of the Walled Town in the Seljuk Period Source: Süer 2006


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
The perimeter length of the walls is approximately 2000 meters. The structural characteristics of the walls are:


